






Step 1: Direction (Vision)
Where do we want to go?
What are the obstacles or opportunities?



Step 2: Projects, Programs
How do we get there?
How fast? How much?



Step 3: Putting it all together. Pen to paper.
Writing the plan & review.



Planning Process – How we will be developing the regional plan for Kaumana-Pi ‘ihonua

Meeting #1 (Today) – Identify Vision, Opportunities, and Issues

Where do we want to go want to be?

What are current opportunities that can help us get to where we want to be? What are current issues we must address before we can get to where we want to be?

Meeting #2 (October) – Identify projects or activities & Prioritize.

Now that we know where we want to go, how do we get there and what should we do first (priorities).

Meeting #3 (December) – Review a Draft Plan

Is everyone on board?

Planning Process – How we will be developing the regional plan for Kaumana-Pi ‘ihonua

Meeting # 4 (January) – (If necessary)

This meeting may not need to happen if homesteaders like the draft plan presented in December and no major revisions are necessary.

Review a draft #2

Hawaiian Homes Commission Approval (January or February 2017)

Commission needs to approve and adopt the plan.

Group Discussion #1 – Where do we want to go?

Vision of a Successful Kaumana and Pi'ihonua Communities

- What do successful Kaumana and Pi'ihonua communities look like? What would you see or hear or feel?

Group Discussion #2 – What are opportunities or issues that we need to address in order to reach our vision?

- What are Opportunities we should take advantage of or issues we need to address
- One opportunity or issue per post-it
