Review Draft Vision Statement

Moloka'i homesteaders are thriving on the land where the way of life and sense of community continue to hold strong. Acknowledging the diversity of each homestead on Moloka'i, we envision a unified community grounded in Hawaiian values and cultural traditions passed to us from our kūpuna. Core values are preserved while embracing modern pathways to a sustainable future.

- Water flows invigorate waiwai
- Sense of community and lifestyle
- We practice and teach aloha ‘āina and malama ‘āina

Review and Clarify

- Ask questions to clarify
- Do the project descriptions make sense?
- Is there enough information?

Prioritization Exercise

This is an exercise

- ☐ To see where everyone's priorities are at a glance
- ☐ To see if there is consensus on the top priority projects
- ☐ Indication of what is most important

Results are not set in stone

What is a priority project?

What is a PRIORITY project?

- A priority project is selected by the community during the planning process to be made a priority by both the community and DHHL. Time and resources will be focused on the completion of these projects. These projects are recognized as clearly striving towards achieving the vision within the Moloka'i region.

What happens to projects not selected as priority?

- All projects that help to move towards reaching the vision for the region will be included in the Moloka'i Regional Plan. If a project is not selected as a priority project, it does not mean it cannot happen. It simply means that they are not the main focus of the attention of the community and DHHL. These projects may be championed by any member of the community at any time.

When making selection, some questions to think about . . .

- Is there a "Project Lead"?
- How will beneficiaries participate in the project? How will they benefit from the project?
- Will the project garner broad beneficiary support?
- Where will funding come from?
- What other resources are needed? How easy or difficult will it be to garner the funding and other resources?
- Is it do-able?
- Able to complete within 5 years? 10 years?

Prioritizing by Dots

- Each person was given FIVE dots at Sign-In
- Use the dots to represent your vote for a priority project
- Dots may be used however each person prefers (all on one project, one on five projects, etc.)
- Everyone has 15 MINUTES to vote using dots on the projects you would like to see as the priority projects
- DHHL Staff is available for questions and discussion throughout
