Objectives

- Improve reliability and functionality of water delivery to the over 1,900 users connected to the DHHL Water System (PWS No. 230)
- Address Water Pressure issue identified during 2010 Regional Planning Process

Application Process

- 1. Identify potential projects and alternatives
- 2. Conduct environmental evaluations
- 3. Prepare preliminary engineering data
- 4. Consult with Agencies and Organizations
- 5. Prepare Environmental Summary

Application Process

- 6. Prepare USDA-RD application packet
- 7. Submit application to USDA-RD
- 8. Review by USDA-RD
 - Approve
 - Request Revisions
 - Deny



- (2) DHHL Contract for Services

For each project,

- (3) Project Agreement*
- (4) DHHL License*
- (5) DHHL Operations & Maintenance agreement
- (6) Nā Kupa'a o Kūhiō lease agreement*
 - 15% fee per loan payment
 - DHHL lease rent Nā Kupa'a o Kūhiō







Proposed Potable Water Improvements Site 1- Well Site Compound







Four Projects


- 1A: New 200,000 Gallon Water Tank
 - Additional storage for Kalama'ula
- 1B: Replace Chlorination Facility
 - Improve worker safety & increase automation
- 1C: Install Fuel Tank
 - Provide additional fuel supply to operate emergency generator
- 1D: Modifications to Compound

Two Projects


2A: Replace Access Road

2B: Install Additional Water Line


Existing system does not loop. The new 12-inch main will extend along the mauka side of the lots along Hā'ena Street.


Proposed Potable Water Improvements Site 3- Kauluwai Tank Site




3A:Redesign above ground transmission line to maximize use of water stored in tanks

Proposed Potable Water Improvements Site 4- Ho'olehua Tank Site






1 Project

4A: Tank Improvements at Ho'olehua

- 1. Automate level and flow control valves
- 2. Replace exposed, corroded pipes and valves
- 3. Replace exterior ladder

Proposed Potable Water Improvements Site 5- Ho'olehua/Veteran's Cemetery



3 Fire Protection Projects

5A: Install new water line from Ho'olehua tanks to Veteran's Cemetery

5B: Construct access road

5C: Install approximately 16 fire hydrants

Application Process

Completed Step 1

Engaged in Steps 2 through 4 at present

- Archaeological Survey
 - Conducted by Pacific Legacy (October 2011)
 - 4-days of field work
 - Data is currently being consolidated

Application Process

- Biological Survey
 - Conducted by SWCA
 - Fields surveys completed November 29th
 - Data Consolidation underway
- Preliminary Engineering Report
 - **Engineering Underway**
- Consultation
 - On-going
