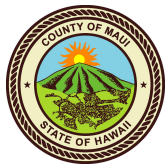

Highlights

2021/2022

- Starting 2/1/20, a \$179,000 Enterprise Community Partners/HUD community-needs-assessment grant project. Completed ending of 2021.
- Collab with Waimanalo homestead to install and educate 10 Hawaiian Homestead `ohana aquaponic systems. Completed installation on 10.16.22
- Continuing to work with the County of Maui OED Ka Pa `Ike Project
- Continued our efforts in getting the long term lease for 127 acres in Kula. Still waiting on `Aina Archeology for their assessment
- \$58,000 Office of Hawaiian Affairs grant to provide an e-commerce platform for native farmers and ranchers to sell and distribute their fresh products.
- Received two-\$10,000 First Nation grants (dates). First, `Ai Pono project was to make CSA boxes. Second, for Technical Assistance.
- Helped establish Honokowai HHA
- Submitted C-WRM testimony on 11/15/22
